For any BMP that is installed in order to comply with the requirements of our post-construction program, the Borough of Peapack & Gladstone will ensure adequate long-term operation as well as preventative and corrective maintenance (including replacement) of BMP's. For BMP's on private property that the Borough does not own or operate, the Borough of Peapack & Gladstone intends to do this by adopting and enforcing a provision in the municipal stormwater control ordinance that requires the private entity to perform the operation and maintenance, with penalties if the private entity does not comply. The Borough of Peapack & Gladstone enforces, through the municipal stormwater control ordinance,
compliance with the design standard in Attachment C of our permit to control passage of solid and floatable materials through storm drain inlets. The Borough has installed bicycle safe grates and (if

needed) a curb opening with a clear space no bigger than two inches across the smallest dimension.
