Summer is approaching and the weather is finally warming up with trees and flowers abloom. This was a tough winter with multiple snow events that were challenging to everyone. Our DPW, Police, Fire, and Rescue Squads all rose to the challenge. Power outages were numerous and neighbors helped neighbors.

We have finished installation of all our generators to the extent that every piece of borough equipment or building that is considered essential has a source of backup power. Thanks to everyone who made that happen; from grant-writing, to creating and awarding bids, to supervising installation, and of course budgeting for the jobs.

Our budget has been adopted for 2018 and we were able to contain costs resulting in a small drop in the municipal tax rate. Assessed values went up a small amount for the entirety of the borough so it's possible that you will see a small increase on your total taxes. Recall that your tax bill has several components of which the school tax is the largest, then we have the municipal tax, county, library, and open space taxes. Each entity has their own budget and tax rate. Add all these up and we derive the tax rate which determines your tax cost.

We try very hard to maintain services to everyone in the borough. During the budget creation every expenditure is examined by asking if that item should be funded for the new budget or should the amount be increased or decreased. It's very time consuming for the finance committee and our municipal staff.

After the retirement of Chief Greg Skinner, we brought the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office into the department as Officer In Charge (OIC). We asked the Prosecutor to examine both

the department and the borough Council and Staff so we might learn how to run the department in the most efficient manner possible.

The Prosecutor spent three months here in town at no cost to us and upon finishing their work they suggested that we amend our ordinance which controls appointing a new Chief. We are working on that now.

The Prosecutor suggested naming an OIC in the meantime and we've done that by naming Sergeant Steve Ferrante to the position.

In the Construction Department we have accepted the retirement of Ruth Spea who is the Technical Assistant to the Construction Official (TACO). Ruth's position will be filled by people from Bernardsville resulting in a greater number of days and hours that residents and contractors can interact with our Construction Office here in Peapack. Please consult the Borough website at peapackgladstone.org to find the office hours. This is a shared service with Bernardsville which might not reduce our costs markedly, but will keep the service in town with expanded hours and update our procedures to utilize online services.

By the time you read this message the council will have had an informational meeting to explain the municipality's responsibilities in regard to affordable housing. This is a state-mandated program that was administered by The Council On Affordable Housing (COAH). Sadly, COAH became dysfunctional and the NJ Supreme Court assumed control over affordable housing. There are various advocacy groups supporting NJ residents who could qualify for such housing and the municipality had to deal with both the court and these entities whom the court had designated as concerned parties.

We are mandated to zone for affordable housing to be built so how to do that became a major effort for the council and our professionals. Uppermost in the negotiations was to determine the number of units that we must zone for.

I attended a round table discussion hosted by Governor Phil Murphy and virtually every politician in the room complained about how difficult it is to plan for affordable housing when the state cannot set the rules. This results in every community fending for itself both in negotiations and litigation. This is expensive and very time consuming.

In this regard, our work is not finished since we still need to adopt some ordinances to finish putting all the pieces of the puzzle together.

When we have all our work done, the next round of obligations will occur in 2025 in the next COAH obligation. Please try to stay informed and attend meetings since this will certainly affect the character of our town.

Highlands District Spring Conference and Achievement Day Awards

The Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club won the NJSFWC Highlands District awards for "Best All Around Work" in the areas of Conservation, Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention and Women's History. The Club also received a membership certificate for the 1894 Society. There are 28 Women's Clubs in the Highlands District.

Three members entered a total of 4 photographs in the Achievement Day Photography Contest. The photo taken by Gretchen Lynch, entitled "Monuments" won a gold award which qualified her photo for entry in the state competition at the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Club's Annual Convention in Atlantic City. The other 3 photos, taken by Carol Ann Hontz and Patty Whitehouse, all won blue ribbons.

Club Project Highlights

For the calendar year 2017, our Club reported a total of \$20,889 in cash and "in kind" donations. The club's donations included the very successful Holiday Wish Tree, benefiting Women Aware, a domestic violence agency, 3 academic scholarships awarded to 3 local graduating high school seniors and 2 Girls' Career Institute sponsorships. The Girls' Career Institute is a mini-college experience held in June at Douglass College in New Brunswick.

In April, the Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club marked Prevent Child Abuse Month with a pinwheel display at the entrance to Liberty Park in Peapack. The pinwheel gardens/displays were found all over New Jersey as Women's Clubs across the state brought attention to the horrors of child abuse.

The Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club has partnered with another local club, Woman's Club of Tewksbury Township in Oldwick, on the "Days for Girls" project. The project provides re-usable feminine hygiene kits for girls in third world countries so they can remain in school.
