As many of you are aware firefighting and emergency medical services are handled by a dedicated group of volunteers who happen to be your neighbors. Whenever a resident or visitor to the Borough needs help, they are only a 9-1-1 call away.

Unfortunately our Borough's volunteer first responders are in need of help. Their biggest need from all of us are more volunteers. Without additional members to help staff our fire apparatus and ambulances they will not be able to help you in your time of need. Please seriously think about joining either the First Aid Squad or Fire Department. They will send you to the required training which is necessary to become a fully functioning member. While it does take a substantial time commitment, the rewards in knowing you are helping your neighbor are priceless.

The alternative to having volunteers staff our fire station and first aid squad would be to hire a paid staff to perform these vital public safety functions. That is expensive, which of course would affect our local property taxes. If we decided to contract out the services and the responders came from a location outside of the Borough the results would be severally increased response times. The quicker the fire department or emergency medical services get to a call the more chance there is of causing either less fire damage or less medical problems. Plus, if we are sharing these services with other towns, the crews could be tied up on other emergencies resulting in even longer response times.

Please contact members of our fire department and first aid squad. Find out what they do, how they are trained and how rewarding it is to be a member. I did over 34 years ago and it was one of the best decisions I have ever made. You neighbor and municipal property tax bill will be glad you did.

#### Annual Holiday Wish Tree Highlights Your Generosity

The 2018 Holiday Wish Tree, located in the Peapack and Gladstone Post Offices, was once again a huge success thanks to the giving spirit of the community. Thank you's are also extended to X Barre Fitness, in Peapack, for distributing gift tags.

During the 2018 Holiday Season, over 160 gifts and gift cards were donated by of the community. The beautiful gifts included soccer balls, basketball, football, baseball and glove, skateboard, board games, craft kits, jackets, PJ's, gloves, hats, and more. The gifts were delivered before the holidays to the Women Aware domestic violence agency. The conservative estimated value of the gifts was \$2600.

Also collected were four duffle bags, 1 backpack, 4 gifts and 10 gift cards with an estimated value of \$335, which were donated to CASA of Somerset, Warren and Hunterdon (CASA SHAW) for distribution to children who are currently in temporary homes in those counties.

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children) is our NJ State Federation of Women's Clubs special state project for 2018 - 2020. It is a nonprofit organization that recruits and trains community volunteers who advocate for children removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect – ultimately to make sure they are safe, and they receive services they need within the court and child welfare systems. These CASA volunteers are the eyes and ears of the court in the community. There are currently 11,000 children across the state who have been removed from their homes - only one-third have a CASA advocate. #### Academic & Continuing Education Scholarship Applications

Applications for the 2019 Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club Academic Scholarships will be available at the Peapack-Gladstone Library, local high schools and from the Club Scholarship Committee beginning in March. You may also reach out to Karen Van Arsdale (karenvanarsdale39@gmail.com) or Carol George (carolfgeorge926@gmail.com) for information or an application.

Interested students must complete the application and mail it to the Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club Academic Scholarship Award Program, PO Box 618, Peapack, NJ 07977 along with a current high school transcript of grades. The application must be postmarked no later than May 1st.

Applicants for the Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club Academic Scholarship Program must be:

•Dependent children of full-time Peapack-Gladstone residents or members of the Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club. The scholarship award covers naturally or legally adopted children and stepchildren living with the resident for six months or more during the twelve months preceding the date of initial application and each renewal. (A child boarding at school is considered to be living with the resident.)

•High school seniors or high school graduates planning to enroll for the first time in a full-time course of study leading to a baccalaureate degree at a regionally accredited four-year college or university; an associate degree at a regionally accredited two-year junior or community college in the U.S.; or post-high school trade school. (Recipients are expected to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study no later than the Fall following graduation.)

•Students who have achieved a cumulative minimum high school grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale.

The Woman's Club also offers a scholarship to adult women returning to school in the form of a Continuing Education Scholarship. If you are interested in applying, one of the individuals listed above.
