Here the two boroughs come together and the street knows the bicycle bells and the hellos of friends; where the stars glitter in the water of the pond and the swans glide; where the shouts of skaters ring on winter days into evening. Along the park with its pond is the street, tree-arched and the sidewalk with its - watch-it-bumps your street, your home street where again the linden trees bloom.

The Borough of Peapack & Gladstone, consisting of two villages joined in 1912, was originally part of Bedminster Township. Its woodlands abound with pheasants, wild turkeys, foxes and songbirds. It is home to Pfizer, which is situated in a bucolic office campus, and is also home to long time business residents such as the Komline Sanderson Corporation and Peapack & Gladstone Bank, the oldest independent bank in Somerset County. THE BOROUGH FORM OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT

The Borough form of municipal government in New Jersey is a classic "weak mayor-strong council" plan. The Borough form was first created by the Borough Act of 1878. The Borough form of government is currently contained in N.J.S.A. 40A:60-1 et seq. (PL 1987, c 379; otherwise known as the Borough Act of 1987). As of January 1, 1995 there were 218 Borough forms in New Jersey. The Borough form is the largest single form of municipal government in use in New Jersey today.

The Mayor is elected at large and serves a term of four years. The Borough Council consists of six members elected at large, who serve a term of three years. Their terms are arranged so that the terms of two Council members shall expire at the end of each year.

GARBAGE AND BULK REFUSE SERVICE

Garbage and refuse will be picked up at the curb between the hours of 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. every **WEDNESDAY**. There will be no collection on holidays. Collection will be the day before. *Residents may place* (2) two 30 gallon cans at the curb.

CHANGES TO COLLECTION SCHEDULE DUE TO HOLIDAYS OR INCLEMENT WEATHER WILL BE POSTED ON THE BOROUGH WEBSITE www.peapackgladstone.org

GARBAGE under the Contract shall be construed to mean offal and refuse of animal and vegetable matter, liquid or solid, which has been used as food for man or beast and refuse matter and vegetable matter which is or was intended to be used, including condemned foods, spoiled meat, fish, fowl, vegetable or birds, all putrescible matter of any kind incident to the ordinary conduct of a household (provided the foregoing are contained in plastic bags or regulation cans; **no paper bags or boxes**).

REFUSE under the Contract shall be construed to mean discarded waste materials such as paper, excelsior, straw, boxes, crates, broken glass, crockery and materials of similar nature, but shall not include ashes, tires, plaster or refuse from building operations or repairs.

Branches, limbs, twigs and shrubs/brush will no longer be picked up by the garbage hauler. Residents must arrange for private pick up or make use of a mulch pile in their backyard.

BULK COLLECTION CLEAN UP DAYS collection service shall be on the FIRST WEDNESDAY of <u>FEBRUARY</u>, <u>MAY</u>, <u>AUGUST AND NOVEMBER ONLY</u>. Please NO TIRES, CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, RECYCLING, HAZARDOUS WASTE OR YARD WASTE. Questions, call 234-2250 X 100.

It is the responsibility of all property owners to notify their tenants of the garbage, bulk refuse and recycling pick-up schedules. If you have any complaints or problems concerning this service contact the Borough Clerk's Office at 908-234-2250 X 100. For all other health related problems call Lucy Forgione, the Board of Health Officer at 908-204-3070.

RECYCLING

Mandatory recycling is required for aluminum cans, glass, newspapers, magazines, cardboard, tin cans, bi-metal cans, household batteries, and plastic bottles. Refer to the Somerset County issued recycling schedule and pamphlet for additional information or call 732-469-3363.

Newspapers and cardboard (cut in 2 foot squares) MUST BE TIED AND BUNDLED.

CHIPBOARD - boxes from cereal, crackers, etc. should be tied with the corrugated cardboard for pick up.

Magazines and junk mail must be placed in brown paper grocery bags.

Aluminum cans, bi-metal and tin cans (cleaned, flattened with labels removed), glass and plastic bottles #1-7, diaper wipes containers, plastic margarine and butter tubs, clam shell plastic (from salad bar), yogurt and peanut butter containers, placed in the blue recycling buckets (or any open container) provided by the Somerset County Recycling Program.

BUTTON CELL BATTERIES (HEARING AIDS, ETC.) MUST BE DISPOSED OF ON HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF DAYS (CALL 908-231-7031 FOR DATES.)

RECHARGABLE BATTERIES MUST BE RECYCLED. They can be dropped off at local retailers such as Radio Shack, Target, Staples, Office Max, Lowes, Home Depot, Sears, Walmart and Verizon Wireless. Some examples of household hazardous waste are: oil-based paint, bleach cleaners, oven cleaners, pool chemicals, rug and upholstery cleaners, mothballs, ammonia-based cleaners, drain cleaners, disinfectants, floor and furniture polish, abrasive cleaners or powders, used auto motor oil, car batteries, antifreeze, transmission and brake fluids and auto/truck tires.
