Mayor Muller read the following:

Thank you to the voters who elected me to a four year term as the next Mayor of Peapack-Gladstone. I, along with our energetic and devoted Council, will work hard to maintain the character of our community, and to provide a level of service that we've come to expect while controlling taxes to the best of our ability.

At the beginning of the year, the Mayor and Clerk are responsible for appointing and reappointing volunteers to several Boards, Committees and Commissions. Clearly, this requires a large number of citizen-volunteers and my thanks to each of you who stepped forward. You are the people who make this town run smoothly.

Our Department of Public Works employees deserve special mention as they keep our infrastructure operating seamlessly. They do the things that most of us do not even notice and they do it well. Many of these folks also function as first responders during their work hours.

Our volunteer Fire and Rescue Squad members answer the call at all hours of day and night and in all sorts of weather and do it without complaint. These are jobs that require quick thinking and physical skills, not to mention hours of training without compensation.

The Peapack-Gladstone Police department answers numerous calls, again under all conditions, to keep the town safe, keep traffic moving, and coordinating movements during public events. Much of what they do is unnoticed by most of us.

Being a Borough Councilperson is a very time consuming effort. These people make the decisions, take the heat, and work tirelessly to make the town operate as efficiently as possible.

Our Administrative staff keeps us in line with a myriad of Statutes, Ordinances, and Regulations that govern how we operate. In concert with our Borough Attorney, Land Use Board Attorney, Planner, Tax Assessor, Chief Financial Officer, Administrator/Clerk and Auditor we are able to provide for our citizens within the bounds of the law.

As we enter 2015, we will have several new faces in the Borough Staff. I will be a new Mayor succeeding Bill Horton who has led the Borough ably through the last eight years. Our Clerk/Administrator, Robin Collins will be leaving us to join Chester Township as their new Clerk.

Tyler Russo, of the DPW, will be leaving for a new position, and our long-serving Planner, Richard Coppola, announced his retirement. We will be seeking new people to fill those shoes.

So, 2015 will bring many changes, but change is not a bad thing. A year ago the Council sought clarification via a ballot question on how it would be possible to use the Open Space Trust Fund. As a result, the town now has new tennis courts, a hitting wall, and a

basketball court. Updating of Liberty Park is a future possibility. Speaking of Liberty Park, we have two new swans, Margaret and Thompson, who joined us in 2014.

January 1st, 2015 also saw the beginning of a shared court with Bedminster Township. The court will be held in the Bedminster Township Court facilities and the new Judge will be Kathy Howes of Gladstone. We expect to realize significant monetary savings in this endeavor.

2015 will also bring us a new Borough website around April that will be informative and full of new information. Please check it out at peapackgladstone.org. This is a result of the effort of our new IT Committee volunteers who have done some wonderful work already, to include free public wi-fi access in Borough Hall.

Speaking of shared services, they already exist to a large degree within Fire, Rescue, and DPW. Much of this is done by informal arrangements, but nevertheless results in cost savings, a higher level of safety, and efficiency.

In conclusion, I join the Council in wishing our departing friends well, and to those new faces joining the town, a happy, successful future. To our employees and volunteers, thanks for what you do.

Especially good wishes to our new Clerk/Administrator Hector Herrera who welcomed his first child on Christmas Day, 2014. Mr. Herrera comes to our borough with a wealth of experience and we look forward to a long and enjoyable future together.
