



The regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Peapack & Gladstone was held on Tuesday, June 27, 2023 virtually via GoTo Meeting and began at 7:00p.m.

Mayor Corigliano called the meeting to order. Borough Clerk Nancy Bretzger read the Sunshine Notice "Pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, Adequate notice of 2023 Meeting Dates was published in the Courier News and Bernardsville News on December 8, 2022 and posted at the Municipal Complex and the Borough Library. Action may be taken."

Mayor Corigliano led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call indicated the following present: Councilwoman Dietrich, Councilman Lemma, Councilwoman Murphy, Councilman Quartello, Council President Sweeney, Councilwoman Weible and Mayor Corigliano

Also present were: Mr. John Bruder, Esq., Borough Attorney, Nancy A. Bretzger, Borough Clerk/Administrator, Bill Ryden, Borough Engineer and John Szabo, Borough Planner

## **OLD BUSINESS**

Mayor Corigliano, back in February presented the Mayor's punch list. The list was a roster of items that he wanted to see accomplished this year. He gave a recap of where things stood. There is substantial progress on eight out of the 24 identified. He urged everyone to make this a priority.

Councilwoman Weible gave an update on the Garden Club. She stated there has been a lot of interest but it is on hold for the time being. Councilwoman Dietrich stated there has been a lot of progress with the library renovation project. There is a meeting set with the architect in mid-July. Councilman Sweeney stated that the police promotional ordinance has been reviewed by the Chief, John Bruder, and Art. It is ready to go and will be introduced at the next meeting with the consent of the Council.

Councilman Quartello brought up the issue present by a resident at the last meeting, who was concerned with speeding on Main Street. He has worked with the Police Department to set up some monitoring. He believes this will start on Monday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. They will track traffic for two weeks and see what the report shows. The resident has been notified about this.

### **NEW BUSINESS - None**

Councilman Lemma left the meeting at 7:06PM. He returned at 7:17pm.

## MISCELLANEOUS DISCUSSION/APPROVALS

There was next a discussion on a suggested Ordinance amending and supplementing Chapter XXIII, Land Development, Articles III and IV, Regulating Land Disturbance and Lot Grading. Councilman Sweeney





stated this issue originated from the Land Use Board. It involves an ordinance to address steep slopes and other land issues.

John Szabo stated that his involvement was limited. He said the genesis of this was the Chairman of the Land Use Board. His participation involved creating a checklist to clarity what would be required as part of any kind of permitting or application that would be required as triggered by this ordinance. As he understands, anything under 5000 square feet and does not create any more impervious cover in excess of 500 square feet could be handled as a lot grading plan through the zoning and engineering office. If the Land Use Board has jurisdiction over a site plan application, the Land Use Board would have control of it in conjunction with the Borough Engineer. If it does not require a site plan approval and someone would like to grade over 5000 square feet and more than 500 square feet of impervious cover, than that would require a permit through Zoning and the Borough Engineer's office. It also defines a steep slope as anything that is 15%.

Bill Ryden, Borough Engineer stated that the Environmental Commission originally brought this to the Land Use Board. He said that, ironically, it does not address sleep slopes. Currently our ordinance defines steep slopes in excess of 25%. There are a lot of discrepancies between what's proposed and what we now have in the ordinance. He feels the ordinance committee of the LUB should meet again. He said between himself, the construction office and the zoning officer, that they keep it pretty tight and he thinks nothing much has slipped through the cracks, if anything in terms of people abusing the respect for the land and the soil erosion and grading.

7:14pm Councilwoman Dietrich lost power at this point in the meeting. 7:18pm Councilwoman Dietrich joined the meeting again.

Discussion ensued.

John Bruder stated that it sounds like the proposed ordinance is much less restrictive than the existing standards that we have employed in town for a long time.

Bill Ryden stated terms of what triggers the threshold.

The Council Members gave their input and concerns on this issue.

Tree removal was extensively discussed.

Mayor Corigliano asked Bill Ryden and John Szabo to come up with a compromise plan that addresses tree removal. With Council's consent he asked that Mrs. Ryden and Szabo take these suggestions back to the Land Use Board for further editing. He asked Council President John Sweeney be the LUB's point of contact.

Bill Ryden and John Szabo left the meeting at 7:44pm.
